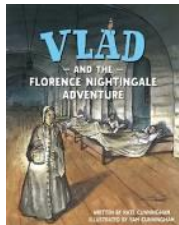

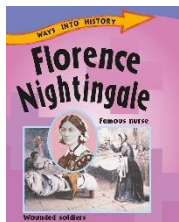

Key Knowledge and Vocabulary

Know when **Florence Nightingale** lived
Understand the expectations on a rich woman in **Victorian times**
Equate Florence Nightingale's **ambition** with their own ideas about what they want to be when they grow up

Know why Florence Nightingale travelled to the **Scutari hospital**
Know and explain what the journey would have been like and why
Know that Scutari hospital was a British military hospital in **Turkey**
Know that there were many sick **soldiers** in Scutari hospital who had been injured whilst fighting in the **Crimean War**
Know and describe the conditions Florence Nightingale and the other nurses were met with when they reached Scutari

Identify some of the changes Florence Nightingale made at the Scutari hospital
Know and explain how these changes helped the **patients** at the hospital
Compare the Scutari hospital before and after Florence Nightingale's arrival

Recognise why Florence Nightingale became **famous**. Know and describe some of the things Florence Nightingale contributed to nursing in her later life.
Compare famous people today to Florence Nightingale

Identify **similarities** and **differences** between nurses today and in the time of Florence Nightingale
Identify differences in general medical care today and in Victorian times

Know, recall and describe the main events in Florence Nightingale's life
Use words relating to the passing of time, e.g **before, after, next**, etc.
Order events **chronologically**
