- use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage
- use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far; left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map





Key Knowledge and Vocabulary

Know that we live in **England** and that England is in the **United Kingdom**

Know that the name of The United Kingdom is often shortened to the **UK**

Locate the UK on a map of the world

Know that there are four countries which make up the UK

Name the four countries of the UK – **England, Scotland, Wales** and **Northern Ireland**

Locate the four countries of the UK on a map

Know the **capital city** of each of the UK countries and locate on a map – **London**, **Edinburgh**, **Cardiff**, **Belfast** Recognise and name the national **flag** and national flower of each of the four UK countries.

Name and locate the **seas/oceans** which surround the UK, including the **English Channel**, the **Irish Sea**, the **North Sea** and the **Atlantic Ocean**

Recognise and name some landmarks in each of the four capital cities including Big Ben, Edinburgh Castle, Titanic Belfast, Wales Millenium Centre

Know that the UK's highest **mountain** is **Ben Nevis** in Scotland

Know that the UK's longest **river** is the **Severn** in England

Name some famous human and physical features in each of the four countries of the UK, including the Giant's Causeway, Mount Snowdon, Ben Nevis, Loch Ness, the Angel of the North, Buckingham Palace, Stonehenge

Know the four compass points **north**, **east**, **south** and **west**

Give and follow directions using the four **compass points** in relation to the countries of the UK and its surrounding seas

Know the difference between a **village**, **town** and **city**. Identify towns, cities, villages, **urban** areas, **rural** areas/**countryside** on various aerial photos of the UK
