

- use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage





## Key Knowledge and Vocabulary

Know that there are 7 world **continents**. Locate them on a map and name them.

Know that **Kenya** is a country in **Africa**. Locate Kenya on a map of Africa.

Know that the **equator** is an imaginary line around the Earth which is exactly midway between the North Pole and the **South Pole** and divides the Earth into two equal halves, the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.

Know that the equator passes through Kenya.

Know that places on or near the equator are hot and places further away are colder.

Know that the **Maasai Mara** is a **nature reserve** in the south west of Kenya. Locate it on a map of Kenya.

Know that 'Mara' means 'spotted' which is what the land looks like from a distance with trees, clouds and grass.

Know that many **tourists** go on holiday to the Maasai Mara Nature Reserve.

Know that you can see all of the **Big Five** at the Maasai Mara Nature Reserve.

Know that The Maasai Mara **tribe** has lived in the area for many years.

Know that The Maasai Mara people live in mud houses. Know and describe what Maasai culture is like

### Make comparisons between Kenya and England:

Know that London is the capital city of England and the biggest city in England.

Know that the biggest city in Kenya is **Mombasa** and that the capital city is Nairobi.

Know that all children in England go to school because it is the law. Know that in Kenya many children don't go to school because they help their parents with farming, cooking and fetching water.

Know that most people in England speak English but that many people in Kenya speak Swahili.

Know that there are some **deserts** in Kenya because it is so hot and dry. Know that there are also some volcanoes in Kenya. Know that there are no deserts in England and that the land is greener and lusher because it is cooler and wetter.

Know and name some Kenyan wild animals including lions, elephants, rhinos, leopards and buffalo. Know and name some British wild animals including foxes, owls, hedgehogs, badgers, deer, squirrels
